Facilities Questionnaire review

Following discussions at the Annual Parish meeting in 2013 and a debate at the Town Council, the CLP were asked to take on a review of the facilities available to the town, specifically around the future needs and uses for a growing town, within the context that each facility was owned and managed by independent charities or organisations with specific remits and schemes of management. To start the review, we asked all organisations we could find in the Charlbury Chronicle listing and on the Town website to respond to a questionnaire about their use of facilities.

Based on these responses, there are a significant number of clubs & organisations using the existing facilities at the Corner House & Memorial Hall. Some of these uses are for two coffee mornings a year, along with some permanent storage use for equipment or materials. Some permanent uses, such as the Museum, make use of the specified areas, along with the front garden and small rooms in the Corner House for coffee mornings. There is a regular use of the Garden Room by the Day Centre, providing valuable services to 12 vulnerable pensioners in Charlbury, on a weekly basis for 48 weeks each year.

The Memorial Hall is often used for AGMs plus specific key use for CADs performance twice a year, albeit with limitations on the flexibility of the space for multiple users during their performance periods. Some use is made of facilities on Chadlington for rehearsals in relation to the twice yearly performances. Weekly social Badminton occurs and suits the users well.

The Art Society makes use of a range of facilities, for monthly, quarterly or annual events of differing scale and purpose, from talks and presentations to full scale exhibitions. Evergreens make regular monthly use of the Memorial Hall and three times a year for coffee mornings at the Corner House. ChOc have a growing calendar of events focussed on the Memorial Hall and report that the facility is of the right size for their audiences and provides excellent facilities for their needs. The Baptist Church make use of the Corner House for Coffee mornings, but report reducing footfall.

Sports specific activities are mostly focussed on the Cricket & Nine Acres Pavillions, although AGM's are held in the Corner House. Indoor facilities are entirely lacking for coaching or winter activities.

What concerns were noted by the users?

For both the Memorial Hall & Corner House, comfort, heating and access to modern facilities along with specific mention of the adequacy of the stage space, changing, and storage facilities, suitable hanging and display space for art exhibitions and adequate seating for larger, more popular activities, shows, presentations & talks. The Museum noted the need for more space to expand their collection displays. Inadequate car parking was mentioned as a problem for users, & specifically for drop offs for the Day Centre at the Memorial Hall, for a range of locations.

Specific mention was made of the poor heating at the Corner House & Memorial Hall, affecting users from Yoga classes, (with some users deciding to leave the sessions), to ChOc and Evergreens. This appears to reflect not simply the heating systems, but the structures / insulation values of the buildings.

Adequate seating for both numbers of people wishing to attend some events and its comfort was mentioned.

Disabled access to some parts of the Corner House was mentioned, with specific mention of the staircase and external stairs being inadequate for less mobile people, although some activities, such as the museum, note that their ground floor, level location makes access easy. Access to the first floor is poor without a lift. The Morris Room in Corner House (possibly the most often used for larger, non Memorial Hall events) was mentioned as it could be "challenging to evacuate quickly for less mobile people. Access to the Memorial Hall is good. The effectiveness of the hearing loop in the Memorial Hall was questioned, and whether it actually worked at all?

Kitchen facilities were mentioned in both the Corner House and Memorial Hall, with cookers requiring replacement, the provision of dishwashers and microwaves, along with better bar & drinks "chiller" facilities. Some noted that catering was prepared elsewhere and brought in to the site as required. Some organisations bring their own glassware when wine is served, along with their own projection equipment and screen.

For changing facilities, those users that require it reported that attendees arrived ready for the activity although some changed in the WC's and for CADs costumes are donned at the venue.

Storage for some organisations is key, CADs, ChOc & the Museum have long term storage at either the Corner House or external sheds or bring in the necessary equipment for specific events, such as film screenings. Other organisations, such as the Day Centre use storage at the Memorial Hall for specific equipment related to their use.

There were specific activities focussed on venues such as the school to make use of better facilities, heating and flexibility of the venue.

Overall, when asked to rate the adequacy or not of the facilities used (as in the table above), users rated as follows (overall, not related to individual locations)

For those using facilities outside of Charlbury, these are for Yoga, CADs rehearsals in Chadlington, Witney, Woodstock, Chipping Norton & Kingham for football practise & Burford School Sports Hall for indoor cricket practise.

Sports & Social Club comment

This is a verbatim copy of the e mail response outlining their concerns, and we await a completed questionnaire.

"We had two people come up to the club and show us some plans but for some reason we are a afterthought. Football has been going on in Charlbury for 50 plus years and even though it is called a sports and social club most people will know it has the football club. We have 2 football teams and if this club goes there will be no where for them to go. We also have allot of family's come to the club as there is nowhere else they can have a drink where family's are welcome in Charlbury so this is a lot more than just a club It's also where the holiday club meet and pick up in the summer holidays. We also have sky sports and show all games we have 2 dart teams and this place means lot to a lot of Charlbury people It will be a shame to lose such a place as this would be the end of a lot of things for the club. My granddad was a fireman for years and ran the fire station club for years this is no more and again a good place to go with family's there was some good nights there. And if this club goes as well then we lose football darts and somewhere to go and watch live football games. People will lose their jobs.
